Planning and Zoning Business-

Discussion on the Zoning Ordinance for Medical Marijuana. Resident voiced opinion on "how the crow flies" method vs liquor commission method for measuring distance. Attorneys from Medical Marijuana companies also voices their opinion to allow the liquor commission method. Majority agreed that it would be better to have a standard method of measuring for everyone.

We had two more reported school threats over the past month. Our School Resource Officer (S.R.O.) conducted threat assessments on both incidents and fortunately, neither materialized. The S.R.O. determined that they were not credible and the matter was turned over to school administration for further action.

We had another extraordinarily busy month. We responded to five fires, 84 medicals and 30 other calls for service. We utilized our water rescue boat on the river for four separate incidents and it proved invaluable. We are seeing a large increase of activity on the river and I urge everyone to be sure they are wearing the appropriate flotation devices to ensure safe boating.
